

The white candle on the altar is the 2021 Peace Light Each year, a child from Upper Austria fetches the light from the grotto in Bethlehem where Jesus was born. The light is carried in two blast proof miners lamps on an Austrian Airlines jet from Tel Aviv, Israel to Vienna, Austria from where it is distributed at a Service of Dedication to delegations from across Europe who take it back, with a message of Peace, to their own countries. Austrian Airlines then flies the miners lamps containing the Peace Light to New York City. The goal of this group is to help the light spread like branches of a huge tree rooted in New York and spreading across the continent.

or a hundred or a thousand if we need to.


One: whatever it takes
