Ave Maria LCC Chancel Choir

Franz Biebl (1906-2001) wrote this setting of the Ave Maria (including portions of the Angelus) as well in 1959. Interestingly enough, the original version was written for a double male choir of firemen. While this piece did not become popular for quite a while in German, American choirs whom Biebl invited to German to sing on Bavarian State Radio fell in love with it and, after Chanticleer recorded it, he wrote this mixed-choir arrangement, which is now the most popular version.

Kurt Bestor (b. 1958), a composer of several TV and film scores and several albums of Christmas music, was inspired to write Prayer of the Children by his time living in the former Yugoslavia in the 1970's. In the 1990's, during the wars there, Bestor was moved to write this prayer. The next-to-last line was originally written as a Croatian translation of the words "Can you hear the prayer of the children," but, given recent events, Bestor encourages us to sing it in Ukranian translation, which you will hear us do today.
