



DISCERNMENT GUIDE for PLEDGING AT LCC

fall stewardship 2022

Discernment and Stewardship are churchy-words that mean "thoughtful, prayerful consideration" and "taking care of the resources God has entrusted to us." Each fall at Lakewood Congregational Church, we're invited to discern our stewardship of our church's mission by making a financial pledge. While there are many beautiful ways to support the church, we simply couldn't do ministry without money.

In a practical sense, a pledge is an **intention** which allows the church to plan and budget for the upcoming year and into the future.

In a deeper sense, pledging is a **spiritual practice** which invites us to prioritize faith in our lives.

In our faith community we are woven *Together for Joy* in life celebrations and obstacles alike through our covenant and shared values. That deep joy has been built for generations at LCC and will keep growing for generations to come, thanks to faithful stewardship.

Your pledge is a joyful practice of giving & receiving through the church we love.

QUESTIONS for REFLECTION

- Where did you learn the word "stewardship"? What does it mean to you?
- What or who do you take care of in your life? Does it bring you joy? Sometimes? Always? Never?
- Think of one person (or a few people!) who have inspired you this year at LCC. Have you told them? If not, now is a great time to do it!
- If you suddenly came upon a million dollars, would you give a portion to the church? What do you hope the church would do with it?
- If LCC disappeared tomorrow, how would your life change?

Give me some PRACTICAL ADVICE!

Pledging is a personal decision with no right or wrong answers. Even the smallest gift is a meaningful way of expressing your commitment to your faith! But sometimes it helps to have a place to start. The charts on the back of this page might help, but here are a few other tidbits to consider:

- The two most common annual pledges at LCC for 2022 were \$1,200 and \$3,600 (\$100 and \$300/month). *Some easy, well-rounded numbers.*
- *Think about the bills that are essential in your home.* Is there one you can "match" with your monthly pledge to remind you that church is essential too?
- Last year, we spent \$477 on toilet paper and \$7,261 on our electricity bill. *Consider "sponsoring" one of those essentials this year.*
