Confession and Assurance Call to Confession

Prayer of Confession

One: Most merciful God of grace,

All: we confess to you, in community, that we have participated in systems of sin: in the cycle of greed and scarcity; in the fear perpetuated by hierarchies; in shaming and shunning; in choosing power and prestige over "the least of these;" in failure to reduce harm and suffering for your beloved children; and in failure to see our own selves as beloved and belonging.

We have worked against your dream, O God, a place where all people are liberated and whole. We have not loved your creation with our whole heart; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves; we have not loved ourselves. For the sake of Jesus, who showed us the way to love above all, have mercy on us. 
