Service of Holy Communion

Today we will receive Communion at the front of the sanctuary by intinction, coming forward by row. You may select a piece of bread and dip it in juice, or choose a pre-packaged cup. If you are unable to come forward but would like to receive Communion, please signal to the ushers and they will come to you.

Invitation to Communion
